## Express Yourself: Artful Storytime with Joslyn Art Museum

**Thursdays, June 8, 15, 22, 29 @ 10:30 am**

Young learners and their adult chaperones are invited to attend this drop-in program at Carter Lake Public Library, 1120 Willow Drive. Sessions include storytime presented by a librarian, complete with songs and creative movement, plus a hands-on art activity inspired by a Museum work.

*Express Yourself* is free; geared toward preschoolers, but all ages are welcome; children must be accompanied by an adult.
