A Historical-data Supplement to the 2009 Joslyn Art Museum Annual Report

Statistics At-a-Glance

- 177,037 visited Joslyn Art Museum.
- 146 works of art were acquired by Joslyn Art Museum through gift or purchase in the following areas: American (123), American Indian (11), Western (7), and European (5).
- 31 works of art were lent by Joslyn to other institutions, including an international loan of Veronese's *Venus at her Toilette* (ca. 1582) to the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, and Musée du Louvre, Paris, for the exhibition *Titian*, *Tintoretto*, *Veronese: Rivals in Renaissance Venice*.
- 16 works of art were lent by other institutions and individuals to Joslyn's permanent collection.
- 12 special exhibitions were on view at the Museum.
- 40,659 attended tours, lectures, gallery talks, special programs for adults, art classes, camps, and community and partnership events at Joslyn.
- The Museum ended the year with 5,253 member households with an additional 10,000 participants through the Passport Partners program.
- 35,653 attended music programs at Joslyn.
- 109,358 participated in Joslyn outreach programs, programs for teachers and students, and utilized the Museum's virtual and hands-on resources.
- Volunteers logged 13,964 hours of service for the Museum's Art Reference Library; Museum Shop; Membership; Education (including the docent program and JAMbassadors); Marketing and Communications department (including visitor services, music series, and the opening weekends of the Peter Kiewit Foundation Sculpture Garden and Discovery Garden); Young Art Patrons events; and Joslyn Art Museum Association events and programs.
- Joslyn's Abrahams Library cataloged 260 new volumes.
- Joslyn's website, www.joslyn.org, had 132,489 page loads by 102,372 unique visitors (79,366 first time visitors and 23,006 returning visitors).
- Joslyn Art Museum receives numerous requests from around the world for images of art works from its permanent collection. These images are used in textbooks, exhibition catalogues, books, and other publications; featured on posters, cards, and calendars; and used in films, videos, or television programs. Of the images requested in 2009, seventy percent were for works from Joslyn's Margre H. Durham Center for Western Studies. One of these requests, from Nebraska Educational Telecommunications (NET) Television and The Nebraska State Historical Society, was for Karl Bodmer's Buffalo and Elk on the Upper Missouri to appear in the documentary Beef State. Other requestors included The Metropolitan Museum of Art, The Museum of Modern Art, the National Park Service, and the Lewis and Clark Foundation.
