A Historical-date Supplement to the 2011 Joslyn Art Museum Annual Report

Statistics At-a-Glance

- 114,254 visited Joslyn Art Museum.
- 65 active docents gave a total of 4,479 volunteer hours to the Museum and its visitors.
- 3 works of art were acquired by Joslyn Art Museum through gift or purchase.
- 11 works of art were lent by Joslyn to other institutions, including the Smithsonian American Art Museum, Art Institute of Chicago, Museo Thyssen-Bornemisza (Madrid, Spain), The Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, and Francine and Sterling Clark Art Institute (Williamstown, MA).
- 4 works of art were lent by other institutions or individuals to Joslyn's permanent collection.
- 8 special exhibitions were on view at the Museum.
- Joslyn Art Museum's educational programming reached 238,971 people, both in the Museum and through outreach:
 - Guided Tours (558 total tours; 14,305 participants)
 - Studio Programs including Art Classes (748 classes & programs; 9,022 participants)
 - Adult, Youth, Family, & Community Programs (117 programs; 13,143 participants)
 - Teacher & Student Programs (39 programs; 3,036 participants)
 - Outreach Programs, including trunks, Teacher Resource Center materials, distance learning, and outreach lectures (181,546 participants)
 - Self-Guided Resources, including Scott EdTech Gallery, Art Packs, SCVNGR, and Kids Can Do Art (17,919 participants)
- The Museum ended the year with 4,900 member households.
- Joslyn launched a new website on May 25, 2011. From launch date to the end of the year, www.joslyn.org had 92,893 unique visitors (80% new visitors; 20% return visitors) and 3,012,703 page views.
