Joslyn Art Museum is taking on a special community art project based on the “Knit Graffiti Movement” and celebrating *The Knitting Girl*, a painting in the exhibition *Joslyn Treasures: Well Traveled & Rarely Seen*.

On Sunday, August 28<sup>th</sup>, 1-4 pm, during a free Family Fun Day, we'll unveil 100 feet of hand-railing wrapped with colorful yarn squares. We have exactly 23 days to make this project happen...help us do it!

### WE NEED:

12” x 4.5”, knit or crocheted, flat rectangles (as many as you want to send)

### REQUIREMENTS:

Your pieces may be longer than 12” but must be roughly 4.5” wide. Any gauge of yarn can be used; let's make it colorful!

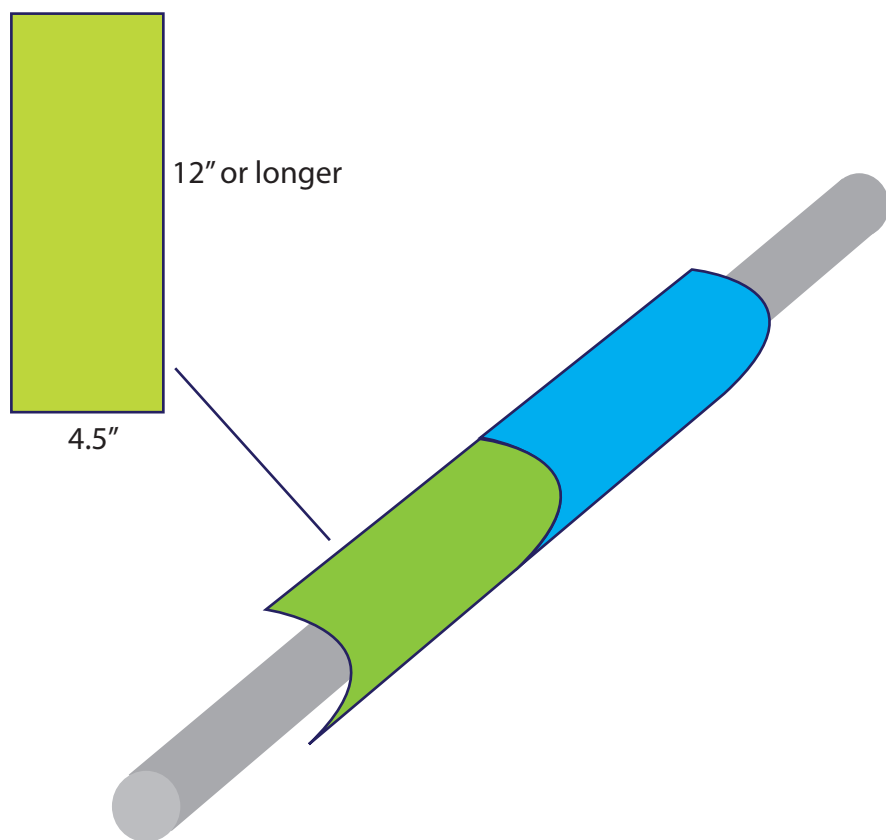

In order to “yarn bomb” the Joslyn staircase railing we will need 100 12” x 4.5” knit or crocheted flat rectangles. Your piece may be longer than 12” but must be roughly 4.5” wide.

Any gauge of yarn can be used and solid bright colors are preferred. You are welcome to include small embellishments like stripes, creative stitches or embroidered initials to give your piece of this installation some individuality.

The rectangles will be connected end to end and then stitched along the back when installed on the railing, forming a long sleeve.
